Canine Respiratory Illness Update

Many of us have been watching the news and learning about the newly reported and ominous sounding "mystery respiratory illness" affecting dogs across the United States.

There have been cases reported in Wisconsin now.

This canine illness presents with common upper respiratory symptoms, just like the more common Bordetella/kennel cough: sneezing, coughing, watery eyes, nasal discharge, lethargy, and disinterest in food. After several days to a week of coughing, the affected dog can develop pneumonia and their health can further deteriorate. From all that vets have seen, healthy dogs that contract this illness but get early treatment make a full recovery.

We know how important attending dog training is you and your dog's well-being. And we definitely enjoy seeing you at class but we would like to ask you to stay home if you notice any of the previously mentioned symptoms and seek veterinary care if needed. While in class, please do not let your dogs make contact with other dogs and do not share water bowls. As a precaution, we will be increasing the frequency of cleaning of our floors with a disinfectant.

To help keep your dog safer, please make sure your dog is up to date on all their core vaccines as recommended by your vet.

New Year's Resolutions for you and your dog

It's that time of year again – a time of self-reflection and good intentions. No doubt you made New Year's resolutions for yourself, but how about some resolutions that will benefit your dog, too? Simple changes will set you up for success and can enhance your dog's quality of life and deepen your relationship. Here are five easy ways to make this year wonderful for you and your dog.

Change the route of your daily walks

Walks don't just provide you and your dog with exercise, they're a source of mental stimulation, too. But the same walk, day after day, gets boring and predictable. Try taking a different path every week, so your dog gets some new sights and smells. It can be as simple as turning right at the end of your street instead of left or reversing your usual route. You can even hop in the car and drive to a new park or neighborhood for a change of pace.

Rotate your dog's toys weekly

Providing your dog with variety in their toys is another way of preventing boredom. Make sure they have enough toys to keep them busy at any given time and put the rest away. Then once a week, change them around. You don't have to keep buying new toys to pique their interest – an old toy will seem fresh and exciting when it hasn't been seen for a while. Be aware of any special favorites. Some dogs take comfort in certain toys, like a plush animal they sleep with, so keep those available at all times.

Play mentally challenging games with your dog every day

Dogs love to play with their humans, and activities like playing fetch or cuddling on the couch are wonderful. But if you add some brain games into the mix, your dog will get a daily dose of mental exercise, which is an important part of keeping them healthy. There are puzzle toys that you can play with together or you can make your own fun with games like hide and seek.

Train a new trick every month

Your dog may have mastered all the basic obedience behaviors, but there are an endless number of tricks you can work on. Teaching tricks helps keep your training skills polished and provides your dog with fun and mental exercise. And by the end of the year, you'll have quite an act to show off to friends and family.

Practice obedience behaviors daily

Even though your life is busy, it can be beneficial for you and your dog to fit even one or two minutes of obedience practice into your daily schedule. It reminds your dog of the rules of the household and prevents their skills from getting rusty. It also keeps you from taking your dog's good behavior for granted. To help make obedience practice a habit, link your training to an already established routine. For example, whenever you put down your dog's food bowl, ask for a "sit" or "down" first.

Testing for Alliance of Therapy Dogs, 1/7/23

Looking for a new activity to share with your dog? Here's the information on our next testing opportunity. Alliance of Therapy Dogs is looking for people who want to share their sweet, friendly, gentle dogs with others. Volunteering as a therapy dog team is fulfilling and fun, and it opens up many opportunities to give back to the community.

Getting your dog certified as a therapy dog, or more correctly, becoming certified with your dog as a therapy team, is easy:

Before your first test, complete the ATD background check – use their website. Also, download and complete the paperwork from their website, including a form signed by your vet that your dog is in good health and up-to-date on rabies vaccinations Complete one Temperament test and three observations (three separate dates) with Kathy Platt.

The Temperament test is done during your Obedience Class, the other 3 are done at different locations with Kathv.

After you complete all 4 observations, send in membership dues (\$10.00 initial registration fee and \$30.00 annual dues) and you and your dog are covered with \$5,000,000 liability coverage while you volunteer as a therapy team. And you are set to go!

To remain a member in good standing, at least one volunteer visit every three months is required to stay in practice!

Complete instructions and forms are available on Alliance of Therapy Dogs' website at www.therapydogs.com

The temperament test is similar to AKC's CGC test. Kathy Platt is volunteering to do these at MDTC so people can get started on this great way to share their well-behaved, gentle and friendly dogs with others. The next testing date is Sunday, January 7th. She will observe you and your dog during your class. That is the Temperament Test. You will then meet with her for 10 minutes after your Obedience Class. After that, you will set-up 3 individual times to meet with Kathy for observations in the community, so remember to bring your calendar. Get started on doing the prerequisites now, so you are ready for your first observation! The background check only takes 24 hours, so you can get it done before the 1/7 observation
